(Building cross-sector partnerships among K-12 education, postsecondary education and the business sector to better prepare students to be tomorrow's workforce)
VHEREAS, our State Constitution, pursuant to, provides that the education of children is <u>(describe onstitutional requirements)</u> and that the state must ensure students have the opportunity to learn the requisite skills to ucceed in career and life;
HEREAS, students must acquire advanced knowledge and skills to find meaningful work and enjoy productive careers;
HEREAS, a knowledgeable and skilled workforce is essential for future economic growth and expanded opportunity;
VHEREAS, (state's) employers have many unfilled positions requiring high-skilled labor, and these positions pay higher vages;
VHEREAS, many of (state's) career and technical education programs are not aligned with the knowledge, skills and redentials that employers need; and
VHEREAS, students and the career technical education programs would benefit from an employer's perspective on the ppropriate skills, knowledge, and credentials that students will need to succeed in career and life.

Section 1.

I hereby direct the <u>(education leader of the state)</u> shall develop cross-sector partnerships among K-12 education, employers and industry, and postsecondary education to meet at least quarterly or more often as the industry needs require to complete the following objectives:

NOW, THEREFORE, I (GOVERNOR), by the authority vested in me by (state constitution), and all other applicable law, do

hereby issue the following Executive Order, to take immediate effect:



- A. The state's career and technical education programs emphasize high-demand, high-skill, and high-wage pathways, as determined by state and regional labor market data and aligned with the current and projected state economic priorities.
- B. Employers and industry are consulted and help lead the development of career and technical education program standards, curricula, instructional strategies, and industry-valued credentials.
- C. Career and technical education programs feature experiential learning opportunities such as internships, externships, apprenticeships, or other work-based learning opportunities.
- D. Career and technical education programs are linked to postsecondary courses and credential programs and provide a seamless transition to a postsecondary credential.
- E. The state shall annually publish and promote a list of industry-recognized certifications relevant to specific career and technical education pathways and linked to high-demand, high-skill, and higher-wage pathways.
- F. Career and technical education programs shall be annually reviewed to ensure that offerings do not lead to dead-end pathways, to develop new offerings to meet industry needs, and strengthen existing offerings.
- G. Career and technical education programs shall be reviewed annually to ensure student participation and success rates, including career and technical education concentrators and students earning industry-recognized credentials. This review shall also include a examination of student participation and success by demographics to ensure equitable access and completion by all students.
- H. Best practices in cross-sector partnerships are developed and shared across the state.

These cross-sector partnerships will ensure that students are provided opportunities to learn and earn the most relevant industry-demanded knowledge, skills and credentials to prepare students for the challenges of college, careers, and life, while helping the state and its employers attain economic growth.
